DETAILED ITINERARY

DAY ONE:

0845 – 0900: Registration and Welcome



0900 – 1015: Why is Wound Management Confusing?

This session jumps straight in with case studies and a chance to dress the wound. We will look at why wound management is confusing, discuss the myths, clinical guidelines and challenges in practice. Then we will explore how wounds heal and the reasons some wounds become chronic.

This session is designed to bring a practical approach to wound management and sets the scene for the workshop.

1015 – 1045: Morning Tea and Informal Discussion

1045 – 1130: Is this Wound Acute or Chronic?

When does a wound become chronic and why? This session will explore different common wound types you see in practice. You will learn about the differences in wound healing for acute & chronic wounds and how you can manage them. This session is designed to simplify your wound management so you can “peel, reveal and heal” with understanding the wound type and best practice.

1130 – 1230: W.O.U.N.D Assessment (Part 1)

Wound assessment is the key to your wound management plan. It doesn't have to be complicated. This session takes a practical approach to assessment for the busy clinician. Find out about what you really need to know and apply in practice.

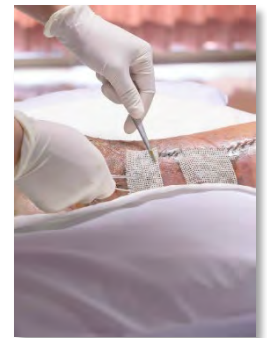
1230 – 1315: Lunch and Informal Discussion

1315 – 1415: W.O.U.N.D Assessment (Part 2)

This session continues exploring wound assessment but with a practical approach. Participate in a workshop for assessing before dressing, learn about wound measuring & documenting

1415 – 1500: A is for Acute Wounds

Let's explore acute wounds in a hands-on session. This is a no-nonsense session to help you make informed and confident decisions for applying dressings to acute wounds. What is best practice for managing skin tears, post op or procedural wounds. Which dressings should you use?



This interactive workshop focuses on assessing & dressing acute wounds to maximise healing and minimise complications

1500 – 1530: Afternoon Tea and Informal Discussion

1530 – 1630: C is for Chronic Wounds

Let's explore chronic wounds in a hands-on session. This is a practical workshop to help you make informed and confident decisions for applying dressings to chronic wounds. We will explore lower leg ulcers, acute wounds that are not healing. How does it differ to acute wound management?

Designed for nurses in all settings this will help you make informed decisions to improve healing outcomes for your patients.

1630 – 1700: Back to the Beginning

This session takes us back to the start of the day and the case studies. Has your dressing plan changed and why? We will recap the day's sessions and see how you can use our new knowledge in clinical practice

DAY TWO:

0830 – 1000: Supporting Wound Healing

This session looks at different therapies available to support wound healing. We will explore different modalities to help wounds heal that are in the Australian market. Learn about compression, light therapy and negative pressure wound therapy.

Participate in a hands-on session to start your day – you can compress to impress or put the pressure on!!

This session will leave you with a greater understanding of looking beyond the wound and using adjunct therapies as part of your wound management plan.

1000 – 1030: Morning Tea and Informal Discussion

1030 – 1130: Peel, Reveal What Does the Skin Reveal?

Wound care is not just about the wound. What about the surrounding skin and beyond this? Is it dry, wet, inflamed, excoriated? Do you know how to manage this?

This session is all about looking beyond the wound with a practical workshop on skin products to support wound healing and prevent skin breakdown.

Designed for nurses in all clinical areas this hands-on workshop simplifies skin management for better outcomes.
